Note that the local Rochester Chapter winner will receive an all-expenses paid trip to the National Competition in New York City.

- Review competition materials

 - Organizing the School Competition and Supplies

- Judging Materials
- Lesson Plans
- Connection to National Standards
- Student monologues must be selected from the 2018 Monologue Selection Packet.
- Hold an in-school Shakespeare Competition, where students perform monologues from Shakespeare's plays, prior to March 1, 2018. Select one student who will represent your school at the Rochester ESU Branch competition on Sunday, March 4, 2018.
- Submit the School Winner Entry Form to qualify your student for the branch-level competition.

Prizes: The winner of the ESU Branch competition will perform in New York City with other branch winners from across the country. The top prizes at the national level include summer scholarships and cash awards. The Rochester Branch in particular provides an ALL EXPENSES PAID TRIP TO NYC for the winner of the local competition!
